I would say that a buck **BRIG BREYTENBACH:** shot or a bird shot, as you call it, falls under -

MR BIZOS SC: No, there is a difference between a buck shot and a bird shot.

BRIG BREYTENBACH: A bird shot falls, does not fall within less legal ammunition because it can kill and I believe that that is why it was removed from use and replaced with rubber ball ammunition.

MR BIZOS SC: But instead of R4 and R5 and R6 wouldn't it have been a less dangerous arm to use for the control of crowds? Do you recall that there was a debate within the police force whether it was a wise decision to withdraw shotguns?

BRIG BREYTENBACH: I recall that there was a debate on withdrawing all lead ammunition, which is the bucks or the AAA and the bird shot, and that it was subsequently withdrawn, because it was considered lead ammunition and replaced with rubber ammunition. As to the specific ballistic effect of bird shot I cannot comment because I am not a ballistic expert.
