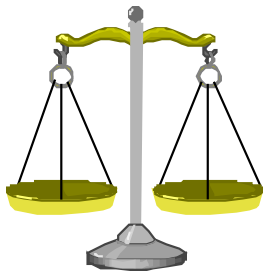

 11 Thanks, Chair. Chair, if we could go to item 33, 239 of
 12 bundle, I mean the index bundle A.
 13 CHAIRPERSON: Housekeeping, do you want
 14 to put in more exhibits?
 15 MR MATHIBEDI SC: That's correct, Chair.
 16 CHAIRPERSON: Yes, what exhibits do you
 17 want me to mark?
 18 MR MATHIBEDI SC: It will be item 33,
 19 Chair.
 20 CHAIRPERSON: What, how must I describe
 21 it?
 22 MR MATHIBEDI SC: It's described as
 23 "Inspection in loco forensic affidavit of AP Viljoen dated
 24 31/07/2010" – 2013.
 25 CHAIRPERSON: Thank you. That will be

 6 this an affidavit or is this a statement? It must be an
 7 affidavit, surely? If it's not an affidavit I won't
 8 receive it. It must be an affidavit, surely. You can't
 9 just hand in statements. Warrant Officer Rowan Cronje, is
 10 it an affidavit?
 11 MR MATHIBEDI SC: [Microphone off,
 12 inaudible] affidavit.
 13 CHAIRPERSON: Sorry?
 14 MR MATHIBEDI SC: It's an affidavit.
 15 CHAIRPERSON: Yes, it is. I thought it –
 16 well, it should be. Affidavit of Warrant Officer Rowan
 17 Cronje, that's item 38 and that's AAAA18. Then we have a
 18 letter from General Phahlane, that will be AAAA19. Letter
 19 from General JK Phahlane dated 25 March 2014. And then
 20 finally we have triple – I did it again – AAAA20 which is
 21 item, no, no, 40 we don't need –
 22 MR MATHIBEDI SC: No, 40 we don't need,
 23 Chair.
 24 CHAIRPERSON: So those are all the
 25 exhibits so I've marked, I've written them in my book from

 18 it's the same one we had last, in the previous exhibit
 19 dated the same day as the previous exhibit, that is to say
 20 31 July 2013. The next one will be triple A – sorry, I'm
 21 doing it all the time – AAAA15, that will be item 35, is
 22 that correct?
 23 MR MATHIBEDI SC: That's correct, Chair.
 24 CHAIRPERSON: That's the inspection in

 23 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Thanks. AAAA16, thanks
 24 Chair. Mr Mokotedi, will you help the witness with the
 25 exhibit?

 6 I take it you don't want those shown?
 7 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Thanks, Chair.
 8 CHAIRPERSON: 31, 32, 33, 34, that's it.
 9 So we'll be careful not to show those.
 10 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Thanks, Chair.
 11 MR X: I see.
 12 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Sir, will you have a
 13 look at photo number 1?
 14 MR X: I see the first photo.
 15 MR MATHIBEDI SC: There's a person who is
 16 wearing dark or black clothing, can you see him?
 17 MR X: Yes, sir.

 19 position to identify the gent, the person?

 22 CHAIRPERSON: That's alright because we
 23 can't see his face. Perhaps we should put on record that
 24 according to the key, photograph 1 shows the beginning of

 3 that photo?
 4 MR X: I do appear on that photo.

 8 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Are you familiar with
 9 this spot where the photo was taken?
 10 MR X: I am.

 21 witness, it's a translation of what appears in the key.
 22 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Sir, will you proceed
 23 and tell us what happened at this spot?
 24 MR X: Two fires were lit there, Mr
 25 Chairperson.

 2 the fires lit?
 3 MR X: The two fires that were lit, this
 4 is where the rituals were conducted.
 5 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Will you please go over
 6 to page 35, sorry, photo 35.
 7 [09:35] Which is described as showing, "Toon 'n
 8 woltoutjie soos aan die takkies van 'n bos by die tweede
 9 punt wat deur die beweerde getuie uitgewys aangetref is."
 10 It shows a wool, rope of a wool as fastened on the trees.
 11 Now if you look at that photo 35 it shows an oval
 12 encirclement as shown on the screen. Can you see that?
 13 CHAIRPERSON: Before we carry on, the key
 14 says in respect of photo 35 "Toon 'n woltoutjie soos aan
 15 die takkies van 'n bos by die tweede punt wat deur die
 16 beweerde getuie uitgewys aangetref is," which means it
 17 shows a skein of wool as it was shown on the branches of a
 18 bush at the second point which was pointed out by alleged
 19 witness.
 20 MR MATHIBEDI SC: The object shown to
 21 you, which is within the oval encirclement, are you in a
 22 position to describe it?
 23 MR X: Those were ropes hanging, these
 24 were the ropes in which the sheets were fastened.
 25 MR MATHIBEDI SC: When were the sheets

1 CHAIRPERSON: The plural of sheep is
 2 sheep.
 3 MR MAHLANGU: Ja, actually that's sheep.
 4 CHAIRPERSON: The plural of sheet is
 5 sheets.
 6 MR MAHLANGU: It showed two sheep, S-H-E-
 7 E-P, fastened with a sheet, S-H-E-E-T.
 8 MR MATHIBEDI SC: From where were the two
 9 sheep obtained?
 10 MR X: They were fetched from the
 11 settlement, the shack settlement.

 13 the two sheep?
 14 MR X: The two were put on the fires that
 15 were lit, the two fires that were lit.
 16 MR MATHIBEDI SC: By whom were they put
 17 on the fire?
 18 MR X: The traditional healer, the
 19 inyanga.
 20 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Are you in a position
 21 to state whether the two sheep were alive or not at the
 22 time that they were put on the fire?
 23 MR X: They were wrapped in the sheets,
 24 Mr Chairperson, alive. They were wrapped around the
 25 sheets, alive.

 19 COMMISSIONER HEMRAJ: Can you tell us how
 20 many sheets there were and what they were used for?
 21 MR MAHLANGU: The question is how many
 22 were there?
 23 MR X: These two sheets were, the two
 24 sheep, S-H-E-E-P, were fastened with the two sheets, a
 25 black and a white sheep, sheeps.

1 MR MATHIBEDI SC: What ultimately
 2 happened to the two sheep?
 3 MR X: They were fastened.
 4 MR MATHIBEDI SC: We are at the stage
 5 where they were put alive on top of the fire. What
 6 happened thereafter?
 7 MR X: As I say, they were fastened when
 8 they were put on the fire alive.
 9 MR MATHIBEDI SC: And what happened after
 10 they were put on the fire alive?
 11 MR X: From this exercise, Mr
 12 Chairperson, some water, black water emerged and it was
 13 then said the people that were to undergo the rituals, this
 14 water was going to be used on them. I left the others who
 15 were there. One of the two witchdoctors, that is the son
 16 [or the boys, he refers to them] took me and others to the
 17 river to go and be washed, to be cleansed. We went to the
 18 river. We arrived at the river and undressed. The inyanga
 19 stood in front of us. We went into the water naked.
 20 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Will you proceed and
 21 tell us what happened?
 22 MR X: As I said, the witchdoctor stood
 23 in front of us. As the water was flowing towards us the
 24 traditional healer poured the water in front of us to come
 25 with a stream. First he put muti into our mouths and while

Some others than followed. 3 There were many of us, Chairperson. We were coming out as 4 there were many of us on this mountain. We came back with 5 the person who had accompanied us to the water to be 6 cleansed. We went back to the original place where the 7 rituals were conducted and when we came back the mixture 8 had been prepared, the mixture of the burnt sheep with the 9 water that emerged from the sheep and the blood, and also 10 fat. We were then told the secrets of the mountain end 11 there, that they don't have to be taken out of the 12 mountain, that men shall be turned into men, that rituals 13 from the mountain shall be conducted, people would be cut, 14 there would be cuttings on their bodies. The rules of the 15 mountains, that the rules pertained also to being with 16 women, to have, to be intimate with a woman, one would have 17 to abstain for seven days, that one does not have to point 18 at a person with a clenched fist, that one does not have to 19 keep a stick raised, facing up, one does not have to walk 20 where there is water, not to eat pork, not to eat sheep, no 21 fish, not to wear a watch, no golden tooth, one shouldn't 22 wear a tooth made of gold, no necklace. One was not to 23 carry any money that is silver. 24 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Sir – 25 MR MPOFU: Chairperson, I didn't want to</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">Page 31001</p> <p>1 interrupt the witness. I just wanted to raise a formal 2 objection to the use of a term that represents racist and 3 colonial past, that belittles African belief systems, 4 witchdoctor – 5 CHAIRPERSON: You mean the use of the 6 word "witchdoctor," yes. 7 MR MPOFU: Yes. 8 CHAIRPERSON: Yes, Mr Mahlangu did 9 correct himself. 10 MR MPOFU: Ja, well – 11 CHAIRPERSON: When he used it he then 12 said traditional healer I think instead, but – 13 MR MPOFU: Ja. 14 MR MAHLANGU: Traditional healer. 15 MR MPOFU: Just for the record, yes. 16 CHAIRPERSON: Traditional healer, yes. 17 MR MAHLANGU: Traditional healer, yes. 18 CHAIRPERSON: You corrected yourself. That we were 5 warned that we are not to shoot before the police did so 6 because if we did so then we would be capable of being 7 shot, but if we don't do that their police guns would not 8 be able to shoot us. 9 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Sir, later on in the 10 evidence we will show a video clip showing the protesters 11 whilst they were talking to General Mpembe on the 13th. 12 MR X: Yes, Sir. 13 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Were you present when 14 General Mpembe had a discussion with the protesters on the 15 13th? 16 MR X: I was there, Sir. 17 MR MATHIBEDI SC: We will play a video, a 18 clip of a video showing the strikers squatting whilst 19 talking to, some whilst talking to General Mpembe. Was 20 that your observation? 21 MR X: That was the instruction given to 22 us by the traditional healer. 23 MR MATHIBEDI SC: The clip also shows 24 some of the strikers making a clicking sound using the 25 weapons in their possession.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">Page 31003</p> <p>1 MR X: Yes, this was a way, Sir, of 2 hastening the effects of the muti that was given to us so 3 that the police should also be in a hurry to shoot us. 4 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Why did the strikers 5 conduct themselves as I've described? 6 MR X: We were doing this in order to 7 encourage the police to hasten, shoot with rubber bullets. 8 MR MATHIBEDI SC: The video clip will 9 also show that General Mpembe gave the strikers an 10 instruction to lay down their weapon and he was defied. 11 Was that your observation? 12 [09:54] MR X: In fact, Chairperson, we were told 13 not to listen to the police. 14 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Who told you not to 15 listen to the police? 16 MR X: The Nyanga. 17 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Now you have described 18 to the commission that you and some of the strikers went to 19 the river where you washed. 20 MR X: Yes, it is so. 21 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Which day was it? 22 MR X: On the 11th. 23 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Now the instructions 24 that you have mentioned, who came up with those 25 instructions?</p>

 19 referring to, Mr Mathibedi?
 20 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Thanks, Chair. Sir,
 21 you've mentioned instructions amongst other of not having,
 22 not to have money, to divide the police officials, not to –
 23 to first wait for the police to fire. Now the question is
 24 at what stage were those instructions mentioned?
 25 MR X: These instructions, Mr

 21 Chairperson.
 22 CHAIRPERSON: You still haven't answered
 23 the question. The rituals, were they conducted at night or
 24 in the day?
 25 MR X: This was conducted at night.

 20 MR X: Only those that were on which the
 21 rituals were conducted, Chairperson.

 23 and tell us the whole process of how the rituals were
 24 performed at the koppie?
 25 COMMISSIONER HEMRAJ: You've got to say

 21 morning?
 22 MR X: Yes, on the 12th.
 23 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Sir, on the 11th after
 24 the rituals were completed at the river, where did the
 25 strikers proceed to?

 2 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Now you are back at the
 3 mountain, what happened at the mountain?
 4 MR X: I said on arrival at the mountain
 5 the other rituals were then conducted as I explained.

 7 to us the rituals that were conducted at the mountain and
 8 how they were conducted and by whom?
 9 MR X: The Nyanga saw to it that each and
 10 every one had his own blade, razor blade. He would then
 11 conduct these cuttings above the eyes, up on the top of the
 12 head, their joints, all the joints of the body, below the
 13 nipples and above. Below the navel, on the sides of the
 14 hips and behind the knees, on the – first on the toes and
 15 on the front part of the – on the ankles.
 16 MR MATHIBEDI SC: After the cuttings were
 17 done, what happened?
 18 MR X: As I said, we then went down, went
 19 to the offices.
 20 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Sir, we are still at
