- 1. The interviewee should give living references so as to verify validity of the given information.
- 2. Find out the current role played by the interviewee. If no longer active, it is imperative to find out why?
- 3. As an educator it is important to give sufficient background on the research.
 - 3.1. This background should include organisations that were active at the said period, other prominent activists, etc.
- 4. The questionnaire should be based on current / available information as its basis.
- Learners should use resources within their means to complete the project: DO NOT EXPECT VIDEO FOOTAGES FROM CHILDREN WHO CAN'T AFFORD.
