

Shifty Records are already known for their work in the field of poetry with music. They discovered the talents of Mzwakhe Mbuli and scored what must be a music industry first by going gold on sales of both his albums without any radio play whatsoever!

This new Shifty release is even more daring. Lesego Rampolokeng is a brilliant young poet who confronts current issues head on without pulling any punches. His book "Horns for Hondo", published by the Congress of South African Writers, received rave reviews here and abroad. Lesego is the most powerful black voice to emerge from the 80's with his brain intact. A product of the lost generation who suffered detentions and beatings from our country's notorious security forces he limped through university with part of a Law Degree. He is a rarity, a unique kind of a South African war poet, articulate, in English: "words climbing ladders from battlefields, Lesego poet of breezes throwing bricks through windows" - Sterling D. Thomas .. Chicago Times. He is a window into the soul and being of a stream of consciousness activist. His writings are a shocking reminder of our past, a reminder, too, of our present ... picture postcards from the backyard war zone. Well known agit-prop studio group Kalahari Surfers have provided a sophisticated compusynth dub music backdrop that varies from atmosphere to hard dance.

This album should do well with those who liked Mzwakhe Mbuli's work though Lesego has the advantage of being of a new generation and more contemporary. Don't expect to hear this one on your radio!

Cassettes only are available though a CD released in England in a few months should be available on import in the new year.
